Minutes

1. CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Leslie called the meeting to order at 07:01 PM.

Present: Mayor Jason Leslie, Commissioners Lori Tolland, Travis Sargent, Kristin Deaton, and Harold Briley, City Attorney Randy Hayes, Assistant City Managers Claire Whitley and Shawn Finley, and City Clerk Susan Dauderis.

Mayor Leslie announced City Manager Joyce Shanahan would not be in attendance.

2. INVOCATION

Pastor George Ward, Emmanuel Church of the Living God, provided the invocation.

3. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Leslie led the Pledge of Allegiance.

4. PRESENTATIONS AND PROCLAMATIONS

A. Sergeant Ray Llanes

Mayor Leslie presented a proclamation to Sergeant Ray Llanes for his graduation from the University of Louisville's Southern Police Institute's 102 Command Officer Development Course.

5. AUDIENCE REMARKS - REGARDING ITEMS NOT ON THE AGENDA & ON THE CONSENT AGENDA

Ms. Patricia Franzem, 31 Gentle Ben Path, submitted a petition, signed by Bear Creek subdivision residents, regarding the Riverbend Golf Course. She discussed the importance of outdoor recreational space within the community.

Ms. Debbie Kruck-Forrester, 15 Brockwood Drive, reviewed the history of Ormond Strong, the nation's 250-year anniversary, and Revolutionary War Hero Deborah Sampson. She invited the Commission to visit the local Veterans Museum.

Deputy Mayor Tolland announced Mayor Leslie excused himself and proceeded to the next speaker.

Ms. Suzanne Scheiber, 548 Sandy Oaks Boulevard, stated she was speaking on behalf of Dream Green Volusia, and discussed the Volusia County program Volusia Forever. She discussed the resident-approved programs and the need for continued support. She requested the City Commission reinstate their support and partnership with a letter to the Volusia County Council.

Commissioner Deaton stated she would support a letter of support for Volusia Forever from the Commission; whereby, all in attendance agreed.

Mr. David Randall, 99 Chrysanthemum, discussed his employment with the city's Fire Department and role within the Firefighters union. He encouraged the Commission to support the Fire Department's collective bargaining agreement and thanked the Commission and staff for their work and time.

Ms. Marsha Blew, 17 Honey Bear Path, asked questions regarding an airport runway extension and requested a follow-up email with answers.

Mr. Derrick Weader, no address provided, voiced concerns regarding Mayor Leslie and provided details of various incidents. He stated he was looking for accountability, not special treatment.

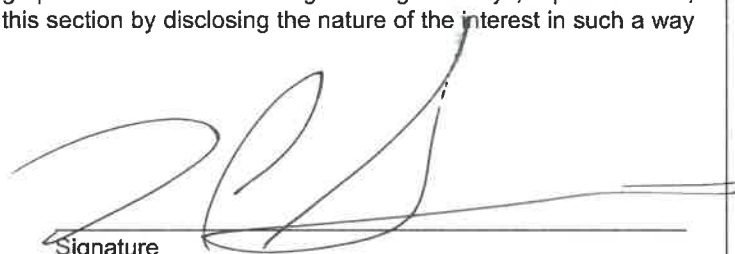

Mr. Patrick Opalewski, 647 North Beach Street, voiced support of the project, noting the need was there for the project by businesses within the community.

Mr. Jim Cameron, 39 Laurel Oaks Circle, expressed support of the project.

Mr. Steven Spraker, Planning Director, discussed the item including zoning, prior applications and zoning approvals, site plan, potential uses, greenbelt buffer, wetland impacts, traffic impact analysis, stormwater plans, and historic tree removal request. He reviewed the approval process, public meetings, and comments made by the Site Plan Review Committee.

Commissioner Briley reviewed the Traffic Impact Analysis and potential impact.

Commissioner Sargent read an email received by Ms. Robin Magleora in opposition of the development, noting she requested the Commission table the item.

Commissioner Deaton inquired if the proposed project was for a traditional storage facility; whereby, Mr. Steven Buswell, applicant representative, stated the proposed plan was not for traditional mini-storage but for small warehouses for businesses and their offices.

Commissioner Tolland clarified the front buildings were proposed for retail stores; whereby, Mr. Buswell confirmed that was correct. Commissioner Tolland and Mr. Buswell discussed the back warehouse buildings which may help the community with places to store work vehicles.

Commissioner Briley and Mayor Leslie discussed the potential uses if the item was not approved and the proposed uses within the project.

Commissioner Sargent highlighted the light industrial need within the community.

Commissioner Deaton discussed a recent incident that brought up safety concerns at Fields 11 and 12 at the Ormond Beach Sports Complex, noting the need for lighting, wayfinding signage, and clearing of underbrush. She stated a recent grant application was not awarded for lighting but would like to see the project move forward.

Commissioner Tolland supported the safety improvements and requested further information on the lighting.
